A group of 34 cyclists from as far as Gauteng recently completed a \$47 km coountain bike challenge from Meerendal (Cape Town) to Knysna in aid of the Herberg Children's Home in Robertson.

Arriving in Knysna last week Thursday, after six days of cycling 100 to 120 km each day, the group took part in the 50 km MTB Race at the Knysna Oyster Festival on Saturday.

According to Petro Uren. Marketor: Herberg Children's Home, this was the 9th year the Spur CA2CX MTB Tour took place - including five years as a road tour and the last four years as a mountain bike tour - but only the second year in aid of the Herberg.

She says the group of cyclists this year consisted of various businessmen and women from the Western Cape to Gauteniz, "who took off a week from their busy schedules to take part in the tour to raise fonds for the children's home."
